

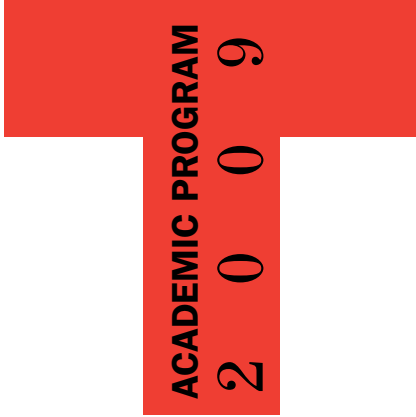

→ Placement Test

New students who are not complete beginners must take a placement test. It is made up of two parts: written (multiple choice section & a short writing sample) and oral (brief conversation with a professor). The test is offered Monday through Friday, 9am to 6:30pm. No appointment is necessary. The written part of the test is also available to do on-line at www.nuevayork.cervantes.es.

→ Language Courses

Instituto Cervantes offers comprehensive language courses aimed at developing the students' ability to understand, speak, read, and write in Spanish.

Communication is the objective of the class, so students will be encouraged, from day one, to use the language actively and to interact with other students. Grammar will be used as a tool to reinforce the students' language skills, which means that during the class there will be time for both fluency and accuracy practice.

LEVELS

A1 Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. Can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has. Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

A2 Can understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment). Can communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters. Can describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.

B1 Can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. Can deal with most situations likely to arise while traveling in an area where the language is spoken. Can produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

B2 Can understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including technical discussions in his/her field of specialization. Can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party. Can produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.

C1 Can understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts and recognize implicit meaning. Can express him/herself fluently and spontaneously without much obvious searching for expressions. Can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. Can produce clear, well structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organizational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.

COURSES

The following table shows the different levels, the courses that make up those levels, as well as the total number of hours of each level. As of September, the names of the courses will change to those in the “New

course name” column. If you have previously taken a course at the Instituto Cervantes, you can use this table to see into which course you should progress.

➔ INTRODUCING THE ON-LINE SPANISH COURSE: AVE

You can also take advantage of AVE, our on-line Spanish Course.

Instituto Cervantes' Spanish Virtual Classroom is an Internet-based educational infrastructure set up to provide Spanish courses. AVE is organized into the same levels as the language courses. Each course requires approximately 30 hours of independent study. AVE has an automatic assessment system that records your work throughout the course, allowing you to review your progress at any time.

Each course takes approximately 30 hours of work to complete. For that reason students registering for AVE will be provided with a username and password (license). The student will have three months to complete the course.

The on-line courses can be taken with or without a tutor. For the tutor courses, a minimum of six students is required.

Students who enroll in a course at the Instituto Cervantes will have the option of doing an AVE course for \$25.

➔ CHILDREN & TEENAGERS

Learning a second language, especially at a young age:

- Trains the mind, benefiting all pursuits involving study and intellectual development.
- Provides a broad base for learning, and a better understanding of, languages generally.
- Develops an awareness of other countries and cultures.
- Helps in all areas of academic learning.

SATURDAY (15 HRS)

One 1.5 hour session per week for ten weeks.
Offered September through June.

SUMMER CAMP (15 HRS)

Five 3-hour sessions Monday to Friday for one week.
Courses run every week and start each Monday.
Offered July through August.

Students may attend as many or as few of the courses as they wish.

CHILDREN (AGES 5-10)

This program is designed to meet the creative needs of children from both Spanish-speaking and non-Spanish-speaking backgrounds while they learn the language. Games, songs, multimedia, and arts & crafts will encourage children to develop their communication skills. The multicultural course will include materials from Spain and Latin America. (Please see page 7 for levels. A1, A2, & B1 only).

TEENAGERS (AGES 14-17 & 11-13)

This program is specifically designed to meet the needs of teenage students while they learn Spanish. The topics and course materials used throughout the program have been included to help students learn the language in context and with their interests in mind. The use of on-line activities and of our state-of-the-art library will allow students to enjoy themselves while practicing the language. The multi-cultural course will include materials from Spain and Latin America. (Please see page 7 for levels. A1, A2 & B1 only).

➔ Special Courses

Unless stated, all courses are taught in Spanish. Proficiency levels are indicated as follows:

■ SPANISH FOR BUSINESS

This course is for non-Spanish speaking professionals who wish to learn the norms of business communication and business practices in the Spanish-speaking world. Students will learn how to handle a variety of day-to-day business situations and acquire the language and etiquette necessary for success. This course is offered at the beginner level.

All levels

■ SPANISH FOR MEDICAL PERSONNEL

This course provides the basic knowledge of Spanish required to communicate in a simple but effective way with Spanish-speaking patients in health care settings. The course focuses on the communication skills and technical vocabulary required for reception and admission of patients, diagnostic interviews, case description, and institutional procedures and processes, focusing on the varied terminology used in Latin America.

Level required: B1

■ SPANISH FOR HERITAGE SPEAKERS

This course is designed to help Spanish speaking students improve their grammar and vocabulary levels as well as to expand their knowledge about the culture of Spanish speaking countries. All the class work will be integrated through the reading and discussion of different kinds of visual and written material about current relevant issues in Spain or Latin America and the Hispanic culture in the United States.

■ NOTE-TAKING FOR CONSECUTIVE INTERPRETERS

This course is designed for superior level students that have already done or want to do consecutive interpretation in general. It focuses on the three main stages of the work of the consecutive interpreter: understanding of the original message of the speaker, immediate analysis of its content and the rendering of the content of the message in another language by taking notes that reflect ideas, more than words, as an aid to strengthen the memory skills of the consecutive interpreter.

Level required: C1

■ CONVERSATION

Students will improve their speaking skills and become more proficient in Spanish. Students will discuss current events, brainstorm to solve problems, participate in role-plays, and prepare presentations to develop vocabulary, reinforce grammatical structures, and utilize new expressions and colloquialisms. Excerpts from movies and news clips will be used as springboards for discussion.

All levels

■ LISTENING SKILLS & PRONUNCIATION

This course provides opportunities for students to improve their listening skills while watching movies and television programs in Spanish. Students will participate in activities before, during, and after the screenings

and learn strategies to boost their receptive listening comprehension skills and their productive oral skills, which involves correct pronunciation.

Level required: B2

■ **CONVERSATION & GRAMMAR**

This Communicative Grammar course aims at strengthening the students' knowledge of the grammar in order to use it correctly when speaking the language. It is based on specific items or topics that tend to prove complicated for intermediate and advanced students. The goal of the course is to learn the grammar through authentic uses of the language in order to reinforce the theoretical and practical knowledge of the language.

Level required: B2

■ **SPANISH COMPOSITION**

This course is designed for advanced students who want to improve their knowledge of Spanish grammar and learn the techniques to write better in Spanish, by enhancing their repertoire of vocabulary and idiomatic expressions. It will include topics such as punctuation, clarity of written expression and elegance in the use of the language, the art of writing and the various writing techniques necessary to achieve this goal.

Level required: B1

➤ **Culture & Civilization Courses**

■ **SPANISH CINEMA AND CONVERSATION**

This course serves as a historical and critical survey of Spanish cinema and culture from the 1950s to the present. We will discuss different varieties of contemporary Spanish cinema in the context of Francoism, its demise, the stabilization of a democratic regime in Spain, the full-blown realization of the European Union & the African and Latin American waves of immigration in the 1990s.

Level required: B2

■ **BOOK CLUB**

In this advanced conversation course students will read at home and then discuss in class a selection of essays, short stories or novels by well-known writers. Students will improve their language skills while learning about the literary production of these important writers and are encouraged to use the Instituto Cervantes Library to prepare course material.

Level required: B2

■ **CONVERSATIONS ABOUT ART**

With the Spanish arrival and colonization of much of what today is known as Latin America, a vibrant cultural fusion took place, in which pre-Hispanic and colonial artistic forms came together in fascinating and innovative ways. This course focuses on the remarkable merger of two worlds, as it is reflected in the works of outstanding artists such as Diego Velazquez, Francisco de Goya, Pablo Picasso, Salvador Dalí, Diego Rivera, Jose Clemente Orozco, Wifredo Lam, Roberto Matta, Frida Kahlo, Amelia Peláez and Remedios Varo among others.

Level required: B2

■ **POETRY READINGS**

A variety of select poems, written in Spanish, will be interpreted and analyzed within the time period and place in which they were written. Symbolism and cultural references will be looked at, as well as how the themes relate to modern day situations. The works of the following poets will be read: José Martí, Antonio Machado, Juan Ramón Jiménez, Federico García Lorca, Gabriela Mistral, Luis Cernuda, Octavio Paz, Alejandra Pizarnik & Olga Orozco. Students are also welcome to bring in their favorite poems for discussion.

Level required: B2

■ **A STROLL THROUGH SPANISH & SPANISH-AMERICAN LITERATURE**

In this course students will be able to strengthen and develop their reading comprehension and their writing skills, as well as their linguistic ability through the analysis of the most representative works and authors of Spanish and Spanish- American literature. In addition, students will get acquainted with the most important literary movements, as well as the different socio-cultural aspects that helped them come to be.

Level required: B2

■ **SPANISH CLASSICAL GUITAR**

In this course students will enjoy learning how to play the instrument as well as learning about its history and repertoire. For beginners, classes will focus on learning simple guitar pieces through good sitting position, basic music theory and sight reading. For students with some experience, classes will focus on learning additional repertoire while developing good finger-style technique. All classes include short listening sessions where students can enjoy and learn about the guitar repertoire. Students must bring their own guitar.

➔ **Customized Courses for Corporations**

Instituto Cervantes offers high-quality Spanish instruction to corporations throughout Manhattan. We will work with you to develop a program of Spanish instruction tailored to your organization’s linguistic needs. Start at any time during the year with flexible daytime and evening schedules. All levels from beginners to advanced are offered, as well as courses specifically geared towards business Spanish.

Placement tests will be administered prior to the start of the course to determine the level of proficiency.

Materials are not included in the tuition fees.

➔ **Private Lessons**

Instituto Cervantes also offers high-quality private Spanish instruction. Lessons are tailored to address individual’s particular needs and can take place at Instituto Cervantes or at the home or office. Lessons may be one-on-one or in groups of two or three. Private lessons are offered at all levels.

- Minimum purchase of 10 hours required.
- Must be used within 3 months.
- A schedule must be created before the start of the course.

➔ Introducing DELE:

OFFICIAL CERTIFICATION OF SPANISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

If you can speak Spanish but do not have a certificate to prove it, or if your workplace requires a certificate of Spanish proficiency or a Spanish language diploma that is valid throughout the world, you can register at Instituto Cervantes for the DELE (Diploma de Español como Lengua Extranjera).

The Diplomas in Spanish as a Foreign Language (DELE), granted by the Instituto Cervantes on behalf of the Spanish Ministry of Education and Science are official qualifications certifying levels of competence in the Spanish language.

These diplomas certify the level of ability achieved by candidates regardless of where and when they have carried out their studies of Spanish, and they are valid indefinitely.

Besides the Castilian standard, any Hispanic linguistic standard will be considered valid for the Diploma, as long as it is used by wide groups of learned speakers and is adhered to consistently by candidates.

The examinations available at present are (in ascending order of difficulty):

DIPLOMA DE ESPAÑOL:

NEW! LEVEL A1

Attests to having the linguistic ability necessary to understand and use everyday life expressions in order to satisfy basic needs.

DIPLOMA DE ESPAÑOL:

LEVEL B1

LEVEL B1 FOR STUDENTS

Attests to the linguistic ability necessary to understand and adequately react in everyday situations, as well as to communicate needs and wishes in a basic way.

DIPLOMA DE ESPAÑOL:

LEVEL B2

Attests to the linguistic ability necessary to handle average day to day situations, in normal communicative circumstances, which do not require specialized use of the language.

DIPLOMA DE ESPAÑOL:

LEVEL C2

Attests to the linguistic ability necessary to handle situations that require an advanced use of the language and knowledge of the cultural customs embedded within it.

The DELE exam is offered in May, August, and November at Instituto Cervantes New York, as well as other examination centers throughout the United States.

PAYMENT

Payment may be made in cash, check, Visa, or MasterCard. Full payment must be received prior to the first class.

➔ Policies

CLASS SIZE

Generally, the minimum class size is six and the maximum is twelve. However, in special circumstances, and depending on the needs of the course, Instituto Cervantes reserves the right to open a course with an additional student. We encourage students to register early or we may not be able to accommodate you at the time that best fits your schedule.

Instituto Cervantes reserves the right to cancel courses for which fewer than six students have registered. Students registered in a canceled course will be notified and may transfer to another section of the same price range, providing it is not full, or request a full refund.

PROFESSORS AND CLASS GROUPS

Professors are not assigned to their classes until the week prior to the beginning of each session. We cannot guarantee that students and their former classmates will be placed into the same section if there are two sections of the same level running simultaneously. Instituto Cervantes reserves the right to reassign professors after a course has started.

Students may not request a particular professor for the class they are registering for.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is the student's responsibility. Please get a fellow student's telephone number or contact your teacher for homework in the case of absence. We regret

to inform you that it is not possible to make up missed classes by attending classes in another course. Once classes begin there is no transferring between classes.

REFUNDS

Language and Culture Courses

Tuition fees are refundable only if requested in writing before the second class of the course. There will be a processing fee of \$75 for all refunds. Refunds will be issued to all students who cancel in writing by the refund/cancellation deadline.
